



WETLANDS WATCH RECEIVES SOFTWARE DONATION FROM SALESFORCE.COM

June 2, 2007 – Wetlands Watch, a Virginia environmental nonprofit, announced today that it had received a significant donation of data base management software from Salesforce.com, an industry leader in customer relations management software. The donation, with a value of over \$11,000, will help Wetlands Watch further its expansion statewide in Virginia.

Salesforce.com is a developer and vendor of customer relations management (CRM) software, used by major corporations to track and manage customer and sales data. This same software can be applied to non-profit organization needs for membership data base management, contact and fund raising, volunteer management, and many other applications.

Salesforce.com created salesforcefoundation.com to implement its corporate vision of providing 1% of its equity in grants to nonprofits, encouraging its employees to donate 1% of their time volunteering, and donating 1% of its products to nonprofits. This last category of giving provided Wetlands Watch with donated licenses to Salesforce.com's Enterprise Edition of its software. Also provided is access to software enhancement applications specific to the needs of nonprofit organizations.
